# **Coniferous & Evergreen Varieties -**

# **Pine Varieties:**

**Lodgepole Pine** — *Pinus contorta* 



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 70'-80'

Spread: 20'

<u>Description:</u> Slow to medium growth rate, approximately 12"-24" per year. Has long, slender, pole-like trunk, which is orangebrown to brownish-grey in color. Needles are yellowish-green to dark green. Likes full sun to partial shade.

## Vanderwolf Pine — Pinus flexilis 'Vanderwolf's Pyramid



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 20'-30'

**Spread:** 10'-15'

<u>Description:</u> Pyramid shape pine with long, silver-blue needles that are twisted in shape. Have dense, flexible branches. Medium growth rate, about 1'-3' per year. Low maintenance tree. Prefers full sun to partial shade.

## Tannenbaum Mugo Pine — Pinus Mugo 'Tannenbaum'



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 12'-18'

**Spread:** 6'-12'

<u>Description:</u> Only single-stemmed Mugo Pine. This dense Mugo stays fairly small, and has a slow growth rate. Perfect for small areas and screening. Needles are dark green to dark blueish-green. Very hardy tree, especially in frigid temperatures, does well against winter burn. Full to partial sun.

#### Rostrata Mugo Pine — Pinus Mugo var. rostrata



**Zone:** 3

Height: 10'-15'

**Spread:** 6'-9'

<u>Description:</u> Multi-stem dense, compact Mugo with bright green needles. Tree form Mugo pine that is very slow growing. Growth rate is about 6"-12" annually. Prefers full to partial shade.

#### Dwarf Mugo Pine — Pinus mugo



**Zone:** 2-4

**Height:** 3'-5'

**Spread:** 6'-10'

Sun Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Small, dense, compact shrub that grows in a spreading habit with upswept branches. Needles are dark green and grow in bundles of 2. Prune new growth to keep compact habit. Very drought resistant. Deer resistant.

#### Limber Pine — Pinus flexilis



**Zone:** 4

Height: 25'-45'

**Spread:** 15'-25'

<u>Description:</u> Large multi-stem pine tree with dark blue-green needles and scaly gray-brown bark. This pine is hardy in cold areas and has great defense against winter burn. Prefers full sun to part shade.

#### Swiss Stone Pine — Pinus Cembra



**Zone:** 3

Height: 25'-30'

**Spread:** 10'-20'

<u>Description:</u> Dense, some-what pyramidal form with semi-flat top and slightly drooping branches. Needles are blue-green to light green and stay that color throughout the year.

Bark is dark brown when mature.

Slow growth rate.

#### Bristle Cone Pine — Balfourianae



Zone: 4

Height: 15'-30'

**Spread:** 15'-20'

<u>Description:</u> This pine tree is the oldest living tree in the world. It has dark green needles with tiny white dots that grow in bunches of 5. This is a very slow growing tree. The same needles can remain on the tree for up to 40 years. Cones are reddish in color and have bristles on the top, giving it its name. This pine has more open look, with twisted, gnarled branches that are dark brown. Very drought tolerant and cold hardy. Prefers full sun.

#### Ponderosa Pine — Pinus Ponderosa



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 60'-100'

**Spread:** 25'-30'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun

<u>Description:</u> Large, pyramidal tree with a straight, reddish-brown trunk. Long 4"-8" needles grow in bundles of 3 and are olive green to green-yellow in color. Cones develop in spring and are red. Grows at a medium rate, about 1'-2' per year. Highly drought tolerant. Attracts deer.

#### Western White Pine — Pinus monticola



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 60'-80'

**Spread:** 15'-20'

Sun Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Large, fast growing pine with a brilliant white trunk. Growing habit is pyramidal in shape with an open branching structure. Needles grow in bundles of 5 and are long, soft, and dark blue-green in color. Cold hardy. Idaho state tree. Deer browse needles.

# **Spruce Varieties:**

#### Black Hill Spruce — Picea glauca



**Zone:** 2-4

Height: 30'-45'

**Spread:** 15'-25'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Large, pyramidal shaped tree with an ashy gray-brown central trunk. Needles are individually attached and vary in color from dark green to dark blue. Slow growing, less than 1ft per year. Drought tolerant. Porcupines eat bark, but deer rarely are attracted.

#### Colorado Spruce — *Picea pungens*



**Zone:** 2-4

**Height:** 50'-75'

**Spread:** 10'-20'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Large, pyramidal shaped tree with rigid, tiered branches. Needles are individually attached and are sharp to touch. They range in color from dark green to silver blue. Very cold hardy. Excellent for large scale wind blocks. Low maintenance. Deer very seldom damage this tree.

#### Cupressina Norway Spruce — Picea abies 'Cupressina'



**Zone:** 4

Height: 15'-25'

**Spread:** 5'-8'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun

<u>Description:</u> Large, columnar evergreen tree that is great for tight spots. Has dark green needles that are slightly curved. Limbs are closely set and vertical creating a very uniform look. Withstands heavy snow loads. Cold hardy. Deer do not like this tree.

#### Engelmann Spruce — Picea engelmannii



**Zone:** 3

Height: 60'-80'

**Spread:** 15'-20'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Large tree with individually attached needles that are dark blue-green. Dense, short, sweeping branches that spread in close rows. This spruce is more narrow and spire-like than the Colorado Spruce. Cold hardy. Deer resistant.

#### Norway Spruce — *Picea abies*



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 50'-60'

**Spread:** 15'-25'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun

<u>Description:</u> Large, dense, fast growing, pyramidal spruce with dark green needles. (Fastest growing of spruce trees) Needles are individually attached. Branches are strong and slightly weeping, when mature. Cold hardy. Deer resistant.

#### Serbian Spruce — Picea omorika



**Zone:** 4

Height: 50'-60'

**Spread:** 20'-25'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun

<u>Description:</u> Tall, slender, spruce with upswept branches. Needles are dark green and gloss with 4, small, distinct white streaks. Branches are cascading and bark is dark brown. Purple cones set it apart from other spruce. Deer tend to leave it alone.

# **Fir Varieties:**

#### Subalpine Fir — Abies lasiocarpa



Zone: 4

Height: 50'-70'

**Spread:** 10'-15'

Sun Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Medium sized evergreen tree with flat, dark green needles that are soft to touch. Bark is smooth and gray and becomes rougher as it grows. New cones are bright purple that turn black as the mature. Not frost tender.

Douglas Fir — Pseudotsuga menziesii



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 40'-70'

**Spread:** 12'-20'

**Sun Exposure:** Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Large conical fir with open, tiered branches that are slightly drooping. Needles are individually attached and are bright green to green yellow in color. Needles also have two small white bands on back side, and are soft to touch. Bark is thick, slightly cracked, and reddish brown in color. Drought tolerant. Deer tend to leave them alone.

#### Corkbark Fir — Abies lasiocarpa var. arizonica



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 20'-30'

**Spread:** 15'-20'

**Sun Exposure:** Mostly Shade to Partial Sun

<u>Description:</u> Large, dense, pyramidal fir with silver gray, furrowed, bark that is immensely corky to touch. (Giving it its name) Needles are soft, individually attached, and sea green in color. Cold hardy. Low hanging branches can be damaged due to heavy snow fall.

#### Concolor Fir — Abies concolor



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 30'-50'

**Spread:**15'-25'

Sun Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Slow-growing, medium sized dense growing fir with horizontally tiered branches. Needles are long, soft, and greenblue to silver-green. Bark is smooth and gray when young, and furrows as it matures. Tolerates winter cold. Deer browse needles, and porcupines eat bark.

# **Juniper Varieties:**

# Rocky Mountain Juniper — *Juniperus scopulorum*



**Zone:** 3-4

Height: 25'-20'

**Spread:** 8'-12'

Sun Exposure: Full Sun to Partial Shade

<u>Description:</u> Small, erect tree that grows in a conical shape. Leaves are needle-like. Foliage is prickly and grow in whorls of 3 when young, and become more scale like with age. Trunk is thin, shredded, twisted and knotted. Bark is reddish-brown. Has small purple berries. Cold hardy. Deer resistant.

#### Moon Glow Juniper — Juniperus scopulorum 'Moonglow'



**Zone:** 3-4

**Height:** 15'-20'

**Spread:** 8'-10'

Sun Exposure: Full Sun

<u>Description:</u> Dense, compact tree with bright silver-blue foliage that last all year. Grows in a pyramidal shape with upward forming branches. Bark is shredded and reddish brown. Very drought tolerant.

Deer resistant.
